Dear Provost Ira Katznelson,

We, leaders and organizers across departments and programs at Columbia urge you to move promptly towards agreement with our union, Graduate Workers of Columbia-UAW Local 2110 (GWC-UAW). February 25 will mark two years since the start of bargaining. Two years is more than enough time to reach an agreement and we expect that the University takes this date seriously. Moreover, your bargaining team emphasized the importance of reaching a fair agreement—a commitment we hope you uphold. For student workers, a fair agreement is inconceivable without

- ✓ **Full recognition** of the NLRB-certified bargaining unit, which is consistent with the Bargaining Framework Agreement of November 2018;
- ✓ **Union shop**, which creates an equitable system of distributing the cost of union representation over all workers in the unit;
- ✓ **Real recourse** for cases of harassment and discrimination, which we demand takes a form of access to the grievance and arbitration procedure;
- ✓ **International workers rights** provisions that provide meaningful protections for when the international workers are most vulnerable and that can be enforced through the grievance and arbitration procedure;
- ✓ **Improvements to compensation and health benefits** that create a sustainable work environment for all, not just the ones who have a safety net for loss of funding or extraneous healthcare costs, especially in light of COVID-19 financial difficulties.

Last Spring, we voted 96% YES to authorize the bargaining committee to call a strike if needed to achieve a fair contract. We stand behind our mandate and are committed to organize for a strike to be ready to escalate if the University does not agree to a fair contract.
